
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CUED SPEECH CORE VALUES

OUR AIM

To ensure that all deaf children and adults can be given full access to English or their home language through Cued Speech regardless of their level of hearing loss; with this they can develop their language and literacy skills to reach their full potential socially, emotionally and economically.



WHAT IS CUED SPEECH?


It takes just 20 hours to learn to Cue. Cueing puts language in your hands and gives your deaf child language and literacy for life.

Cued Speech is a manual system, using eight handshapes in four positions near the mouth which represents the 44 phonemes (sounds) used in the English language. You Cue in 'real time' as you speak and talk normally to clarify lip patterns to assist lip reading. With Cued Speech, lip reading levels can increase from about 35% to 96% accuracy, enabling deaf children and adults to see speech and so perceive and understand (one comes before the other) complete spoken language.

You can help your deaf baby or

child **SEE** every word that you say as clearly as a hearing child hears words

Over 90% of deaf children are born to hearing families who use spoken languages in the home. If the hearing family learn to Cue, their deaf babies and children can see what they are saying and develop a fluent mental model of the home language. Over time this supports social and emotional growth and increasingly sophisticated thinking and communication which is vital for achieving full potential in all areas of life.



WHY WE NEED CUED SPEECH

- Cued Speech enhances the ability to lip read.
- Cueing can be used to support the development of good listening skills.
- Cueing can help the deaf child to pronounce words clearly and correctly.
- Cued Speech enables two-way communication and can easily be used alongside signing
- ✓ With Cued Speech you can talk to your deaf child right from the start.
- Cueing the home language enables deaf children to be fully included in family life.
- Cued Speech provides access to a full and rich first language on which you can build other languages including British Sign Language.
- Cued Speech can be used in many languages.

- Cueing will give you a safety-net to keep communication flowing while waiting for hearing aids or implants and at all those times when listening is not possible.
- With Cued Speech deaf children can achieve age-appropriate reading levels.

OUR ACTIVITIES

0 - 4 The referral of babies through Audiology and Hearing Impairment Services - CHOICES

Choices is our specifically designed programme for the referral of parents of deaf babies following new-born Hearing Screening. We have worked closely with audiology departments and developed a referral pathway in the regions in which CSUK RFA's are based. This has been most successfully implemented in Plymouth but we have strong interest from other regions, in particular, Exeter and Mid Devon Audiology services, CHIME.

The Team at CSUK are convinced that the CHOICES model is the best one for parents because parents want to make the best choices for their deaf child(ren)

WHY:-

- Parents need to be able to get language into their deaf babies right from the start, just like hearing babies.
- Parents have to understand the difference between 'speech and language', and 'language and communication' so they can make a fully informed choice as to which interventions will be best for them and their child. We respect that each child is unique in their needs and each family situation is different.
- The choices that are made need to be child-centred.

• For example, a family may choose for their child to receive a cochlear implant and enhance their listening and English language/literacy development with Cued Speech, they may also use basic signing for communication and one day go on to learn full British Sign Language.

TRAINING PROFESSIONALS

✓ 12 Cued Speech Foundation group training sessions. These sessions were accessed online. The number of people accessing online training has decreased now that professionals have returned to their working context and we are looking at how to re-engage the interest in our online course. We are hoping to devise an accredited course in the year 2023 – 2024.

✓ 10 workshops to schools, audiology services and parent groups to introduce the concept and value of Cued Speech and the range of our services.

LOVE READING

Love Reading is a comprehensive project which includes four workstreams. Three of the workstreams include our collaboration with Robotica ML, digital innovation and the work that we are doing using avatars.

1. Nan in a Van (Love Literacy)

CSUK and Robotica ML are behind their timeline for development and delivery of the second series of the e-books Nan in a Van. This is due to rapid changes and upgrading of the software used in the creation of the avatar and quality assuring the product.

We have also been waiting for our full set of illustrations. However, I think you

will agree that it has been worth the wait as we will have a unique literacy resource for Key Stage 1 deaf learners.

Nan in a Van prototype is already being successfully used in schools.

The CSUK Literacy Resource also includes uCue.

1b. uCue

uCue This APP is arranged into three different levels and is designed to help learners to practice Cueing and to help children to access literacy,

Level 1 - See it. Cue it

Level 2 - See it, Cue it, Read it, Write it

Level 3 - Word building and manipulation with unlimited vocabulary

Parents are starting to use uCue bronze and our early 1st edition has been modified and improved from 60 to 100 words and with an updated avatar.



LOVE READING

iCue (LoveLipReading/ LoveCueing)

Cassie iCue uses advanced AI technology that gives a digital transliteration service: an avatar appears on-screen in a hand-held device and Cues what is heard via speech recognition technology and applies live captioning. The device gives deaf users independence and choice in how they access spoken information. Cassie can be used to Cue read and with practice can be used to support lip- reading.



We are now on the 8th Generation of 'Cassie.' However, there have been benefits to the slow production time. Our test group of lip-readers tell us that Cassie's lip patterns are increasingly readable and her Cueing handshapes and placements are now accurate and fluid. Therefore, while we have made a slow start, we are ensuring

and investing in a quality animation for the future and the software which is now being used is much easier to adapt to the development of other products and resources. Cassie has been trialled by five deaf users and taken to conferences on the Cued Speech trade stand and into schools for feedback and comment from potential users.

3. Love Reading Stories

We have a collection of stories that with the permission of the author(s) have been transliterated by Carly Simpson, and filmed and edited by Red Stamp Productions.

Carly says; "I have been working with a Northeast production company, Red Stamp, to help bring children's stories to life for deaf children" These books have been given to CSUK by their authors to use as part of our Love Stories series.

4. LoveLanguages.

Our amazing linguist and Cue Tutor, Emma Sadeghi, came to the office in Totnes for a full day of filming, Emma has long been in the process of designing workbooks to support people wanting to Cue in different languages. So far, she has been working on British English, Welsh and Spanish and plans are underway to add French, German, Urdu and even Hebrew in the future. Each workbook will be downloadable from our website and include links to films demonstrating how to Cue

the different word-lists and phrases in the book. We hope this will be a useful resource for anyone and particularly for those supporting a deaf child to access the language clubs and classes at school, as so often deaf children are not included in this part of the curriculum.





CUED SPEECH IN SCHOOLS

Our work in schools is ongoing and we are encouraging staff to use CS at language level as well as using it for literacy learning. In our flagship school in Plymouth we are training new members of staff and supporting educators in secondary education to enable the continued support of children in education through the transition from primary to secondary

School.

Assistant, (HLTA) reports on E's progress. "E met other deaf children outside her school for the first time today, we invited deaf pupils from 3 schools to join us for the Love Reading afternoon. She was keen to engage and attentive throughout the Cueing stories. At the end of the afternoon E shared her painting activity with the other children." M said; "This is significant progress for E. When she started school she was very isolated from her peers, easily distracted and often withdrawn. She has been at her school now for just over a year and the change in her confidence and



REVIEW 2022 - 2023 AND FUTURE PLANS 2023 - 2027

Family Interventions These numbers are less than 2021 - 2022. We have partly attributed the decrease in numbers to the loss of a Regional Family Advisor in Wales.

CSUK managed the change from face-to-face to virtual and online delivery during Covid both efficiently and effectively. We were one of the few services still available for deaf children while they were at home during lockdown. There was little or no change in the number of families that we worked with. The reverse change from lockdown to face-to-face post Covid was less evident.

Different regions adopted different practice and individuals varied in their risk response to infection, so there were a number of different elements of change to manage. It was during our six month outcome review that our data started to indicate that we were working with fewer families faceto-face: in particular, Wales was not delivering as in previous years. (Wales had much more restrictive 'lockdown' policies.) We have been reminded never to become complacent following success. As of April 2023, we are now back on-track with our family engagement and attending playgoups.

Digital: Development has been slower than anticipated. A lesson learnt from this year is that when you work in partnership with another organisation, you can only move as fast as the slowest developmental element of the project, and this project has a lot of moving parts. But we are getting there and our e-books will be in school by September 2023.

What have we learnt? Make realistic achievable goals, not the goals that we would like to achieve.

What's the plan 2023 - 2027?

Family Support - How: We are going to need a team who can deliver information and support to parents on making the best hearing and communication choices for their deaf child, this will include training in Cued Speech and basic British Sign Language. Over the next three years we intend to build a multi-agency team with a deaf BSL user, a Teacher of the Deaf and advice and guidance from a Speech and Language Therapist. We already have excellent teachers and trainers in Cued Speech.

Our team needs to be flexible: no one person can be indispensable, and with a team who are only getting older we are keen to train, support and mentor new team members through employment and volunteering opportunities. Over the next four years we hope to secure funding for these new posts.

When: We are in a good position to develop and pilot a multiagency approach in the South West because we have a strong foundation for referral into our Service (Charity) and good support in schools around us, where we have trained many professionals.

CSUK will be the ONLY Charity who will be offering these interventions free for families.

Adults: Some of our resources, in particular Cassie iCUE, could make an important contribution to learning to lip read. Cassie has accurate, easy-to-read lip patterns and when supported by the Cues of Cued Speech, these are around 98% accurate for lip reading. We are hoping to market the resource to adults with degenerative hearing loss and deaf adults.

Training: We need to improve our engagement and increase the numbers who look to access our online training.

We propose to develop our online learning to include units that can be accredited towards higher learning qualifications. We also intend to replace our current exams with a graded skills-assessment that provides Cuers with an easy way to practise their skills and take regular short tests to reflect their up-to-date skill-level.

AND FINALLY

After 15 years with CSUK, Debbie shares her experience of change:

15 years is a long time to work anywhere!

When I first applied for the role I hadn't heard of Cued Speech, believing that BSL was the only option of communication if you were deaf.

The offices were in the Old Abattoir on the top of Jaw Bones Hill in Dartmouth, an address you really couldn't make up! Newsletters were printed and posted, and post was recorded in a book. Cued Speech (International) Camps happened every year organised by Kim Fricker and me as admin support. This was an enormous task for a small charity, they were big and expensive but enjoyed by all who attended.

Financial and time constraints in 2017 meant that big events had to be halted and the Charity moved to new premises, this time an old Tavern. Anne Worsfold retired after many years of heading CSUK to be replaced by Henrietta Ireland. We are now established in lovely offices next to the River Dart in Totnes.

Fast forward to 2023, and digital technology has made a phenomenal difference to our work and my role. We have online training, Regional Family Advisors, digital resources that include a synthetic phonic e-book range and Cassie iCUE, developed to give digital transliteration, and most of my work can be accessed via the 'cloud.'

There have been financial highs and lows over the last 15 years, inevitable for such a small charity. Some things have had to change, like no longer being able to fund the big events that we had in the past. My role is described as Senior Administrator, and the role includes bookkeeping, HR, H&S and general help. I still love my job especially when we hear about the beneficiaries and the difference that Cued Speech can make to children and families. Oh, and not forgetting the fantastic team I work with!
